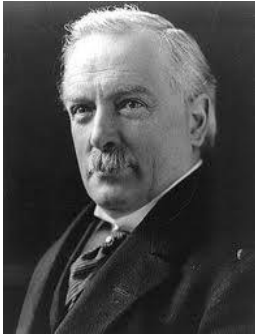

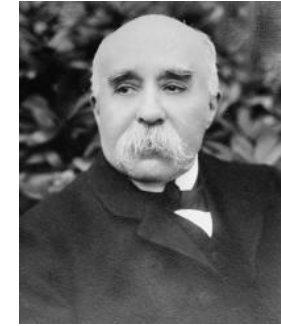

- In June 1919, 37 countries met at the Palace of Versailles to decide the fate of Germany
- Germany had to attend but could not speak
- **The Big Three**- David Lloyd George (UK), Woodrow Wilson (USA) and George Clemenceau (France) had very different aims
- They drew up and forced Germany to sign the **Treaty of Versailles**

The terms of the treaty

L **AND**

13% of its land mass

Lost Alsace and Lorraine

France can mine coal in the Saar



A **RMS**

De-militarised the Rhineland

100,000 men

No air force, no submarines

M **ONEY**

Pay £6.6 billion in reparations <- Eq. To £284 billion today!

B **LAME**

Had to accept full responsibility for the war under Article 231

Not allowed to be part of the League of Nations
