Omnibus means a book or programme consisting of two or more parts that have been published/broadcast separately.  *The literary **omnibus** brings together five of Dickens’ best-known novels: Oliver Twist, A Christmas Carol, David Copperfield, Great Expectations, and A Tale of Two Cities.*
