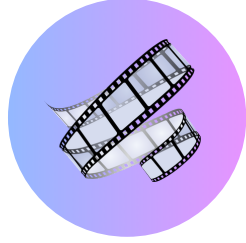


KS4 Hospitality and Catering

What is happening in the world of technology? Be curious, read news articles and columns about the latest innovations and discoveries.



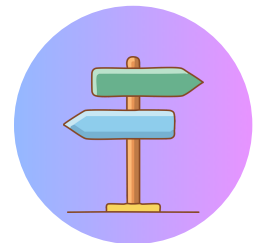

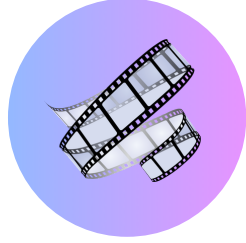

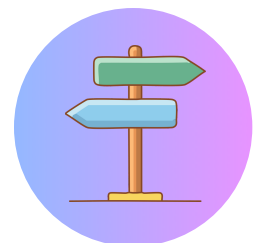
